

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. 850, Manila City as of 11 January 2024, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 11 January 2024 at around 5:44 AM, a fire incident occurred at Dapo St., West Zamora, Brgy. 850, Zone 93, Pandacan, Manila City. The fire was declared out at around 8:26 AM.
