

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Tagukon, Kabankalan City, Negros Occidental

as of 19 January 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 16 January 2024 at around 4:30 PM, a fire incident occurred at Brgy. Tagukon, Kabankalan City, Negros Occidental and was declared fire out at around 5:35 PM.

One (1) family or **five (5) persons** are affected in **Brgy. Tagukon, Kabankalan City, Negros Occidental** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Outside Evacuation Center

One (1) family or **five (5) persons** are temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

One (1) house was **totally damaged** in **Brgy. Tagukon, Kabankalan City, Negros Occidental** (see Annex C).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱6,947.78** worth of assistance was provided to the affected family; of which, **₱4,447.78** from **DSWD** and **₱2,500.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex D).
