

DSWD DROMIC Report #10 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 18 January 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

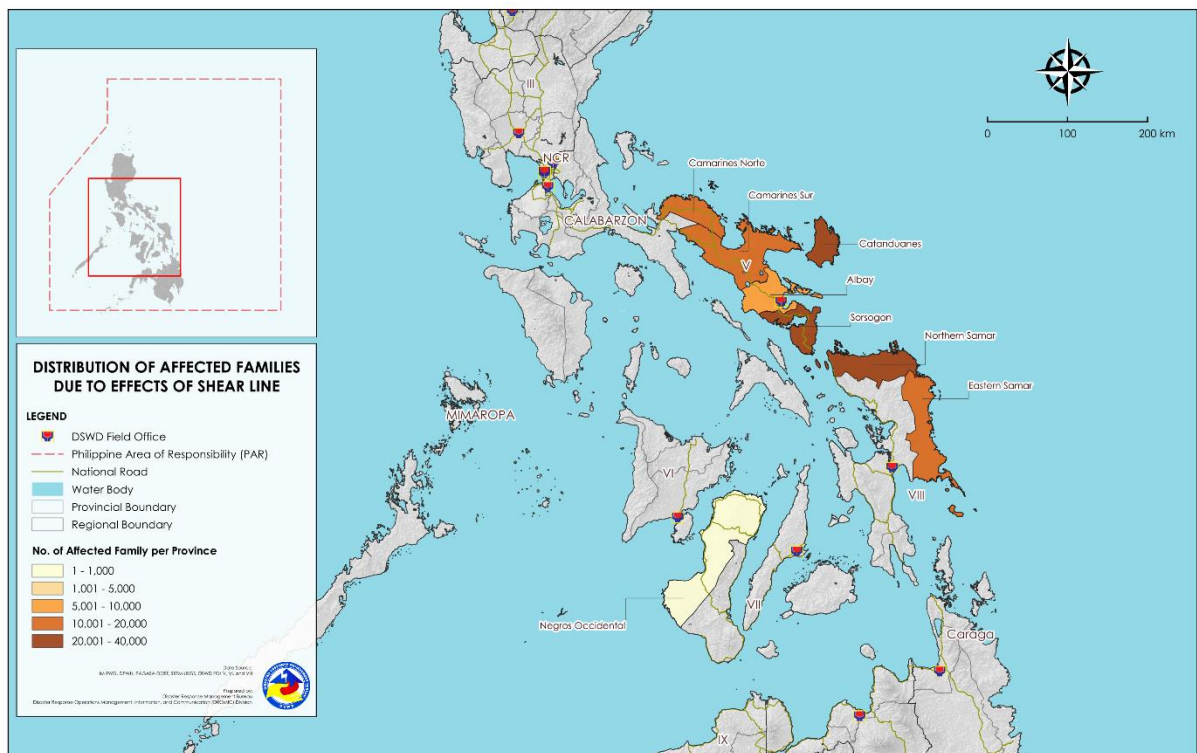
Issued on 08 January 2025 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line that may have caused possible flash floods or landslides in Visayas, Bicol Region, Quezon, Marinduque, Romblon, and Dinagat Islands.

On the same day, various areas in the provinces of Albay, Sorsogon, Camarines Sur, and Catanduanes experienced intense heavy rainfall and widespread flooding. Moreover, due to continuous heavy rainfall caused by the Shear Line, several flooding and landslide incidents were reported in low-lying barangays in Cadiz City, Negros Occidental including parts of Eastern Samar and Northern Samar.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **154,386 families** or **655,554 persons** are affected in **761 barangays** in **Regions V, VI, and VIII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **33 families** or **110 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **three (3) evacuation centers** in **Regions V and VI** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **four (4) families** or **eight (8) persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **37 families** or **118 persons** still displaced in **Regions V** and **VI** (see Annex F).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱26,557,862.56** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱26,228,362.56** from **DSWD** and **₱329,500.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex G).
