





DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Fire Incident at the Auxiliary Wet Market in Brgy. Ilocanos Sur, City of San Fernando, La Union

as of 16 January 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 11 January 2024 at around 2:20 AM, a fire incident occurred at the Auxiliary Wet Market, a public wet market in Brgy. Ilocanos Sur, City of San Fernando, La Union that affected the livelihood of stall owners and vendors.

In response, the DSWD through its Field Office in Region I together with the LGU of San Fernando City, La Union, provided relief assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected populace.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,501 stall owners and vendors** are affected in the **City of San Fernando**, **La Union** (see Annex A).

III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱1,509,299.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱1,117,500.00 from DSWD and ₱391,799.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex B).
