





DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. San Miguel, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan

as of 25 January 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 17 January 2024 at around 4:45 AM, a fire incident transpired in Brgy. San Miguel, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan causing displacement to families and individuals.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **16 families** or **47 persons** are affected in **Brgy. San Miguel, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 10 families or 26 persons currently taking temporary shelter at the Barangay Rural Health Unit of Brgy. San Miguel, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **six (6) families** or **21 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 16 families or 47 persons displaced in Brgy. San Miguel, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of nine (9) houses were damaged; of which, six (6) are totally damaged and three (3) are partially damaged in Brgy. San Miguel, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱667,208.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱230,728.00 from DSWD, ₱349,480.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) and ₱87,000.00 from Others Partners (see Annex F).
