

DSWD DROMIC Report #9 on the Effects of Shear Line as of 24 January 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 January 2024, the effects of Shear Line were experienced in several municipalities in the province of Agusan del Sur and Surigao del Sur.

On 16 January 2024, several municipalities in Davao Region also reported the effects of Shear Line.

On 17 January 2024, the effects of Shear Line continued to bring scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms over Northern Mindanao, Caraga, and Davao Region.

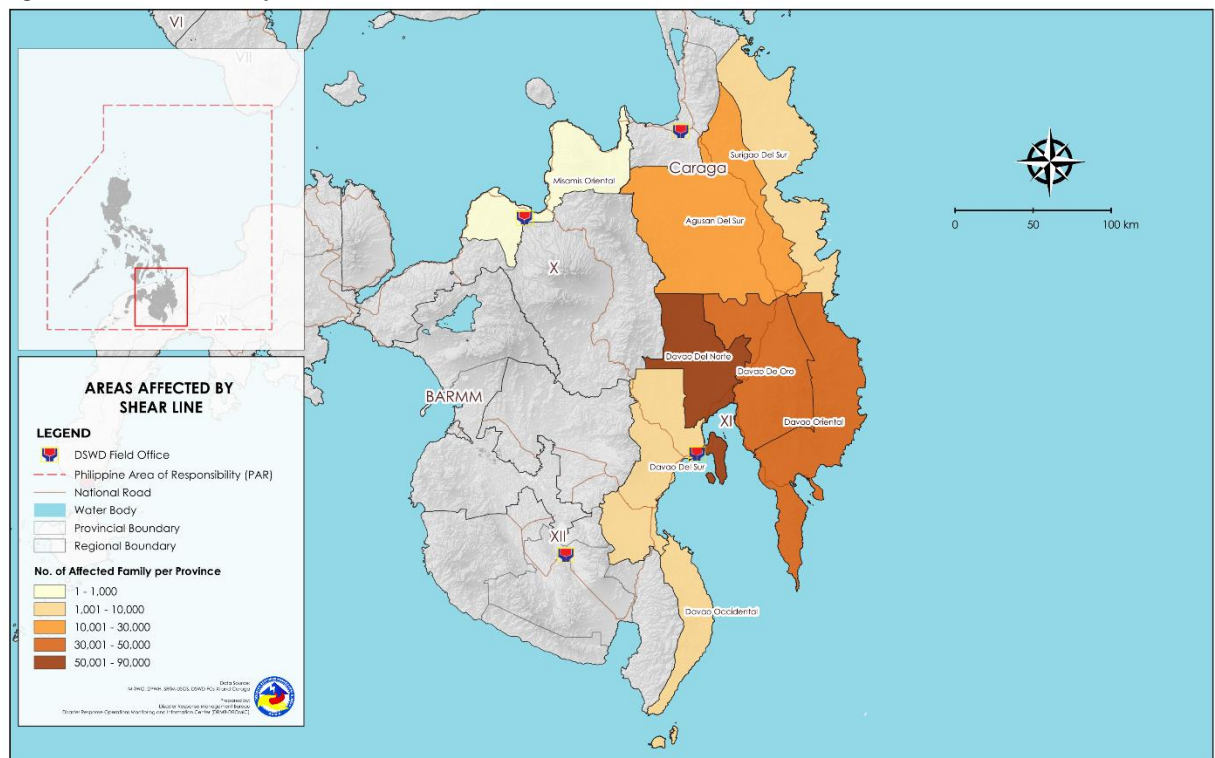
On 18 January 2024, continuous heavy rains brought by the effects of Shear Line affected the livelihood of fisher folks and farmers in the municipality of Talisayan in Misamis Oriental.

On 19 January 2024, the Shear line continuously affected the eastern sections of Visayas and Mindanao.

On 20 January 2024, the effect of Shear Line has weakened and was no longer directly affecting the country.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **190,613 families** or **812,943 persons** are affected in **488 barangays** in **Regions X, XI, and Caraga** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **169 families** or **509 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **10 evacuation centers** in **Regions XI and Caraga** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **2,071 families** or **6,356 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **2,240 families** or **6,865 persons** displaced in **Regions XI and Caraga** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **621 houses** were damaged; of which, **172** are **totally damaged** and **449** are **partially damaged** in **Regions XI and Caraga** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱53,694,552.00** worth of **food and non-food items (FNIs)** were provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Table 1).
