

# DSWD DROMIC Report #15 on the Effects of Trough of Low Pressure Area (LPA) as of 08 February 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 29 January 2024, the Municipalities of Compostela, Monkayo, and New Bataan in Davao de Oro and the Municipalities of Bunawan and Rosario in Agusan del Sur initially reported on the effects of the trough of Low Pressure Area (LPA).

On 01 February 2024, flooding incidents caused by sustained heavy rains brought by the trough of LPA were also reported in the Province of North Cotabato in Region XII (SOCCSKSARGEN) and in the Province of Maguindanao del Sur in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM).

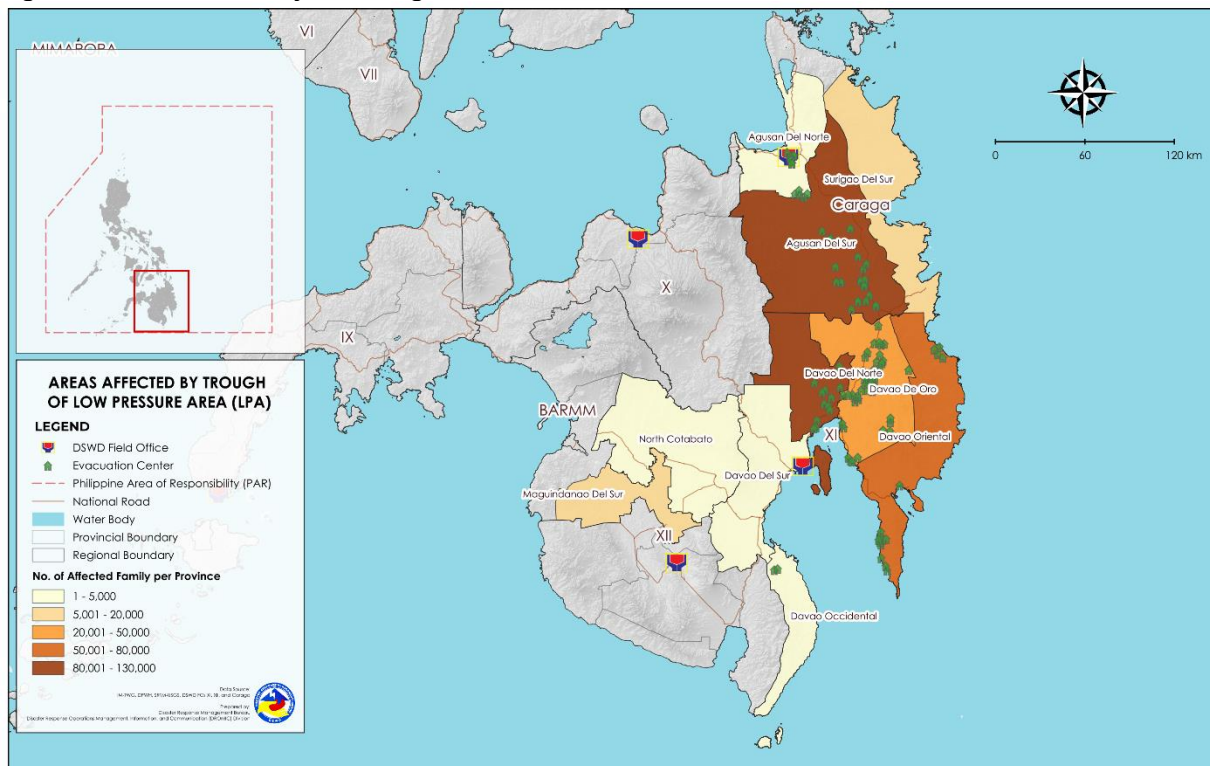
The trough of LPA continued to bring light to heavy rains until 02 February 2024 that resulted in further flooding and landslide incidents in Mindanao. On 03 February 2024 at 11AM, the LPA dissipated.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **354,019 families** or **1,268,180 persons** are affected in **768 barangays** in **Regions XI, XII, Caraga, and BARMM** (see Annex A).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **13,241 families** or **49,023 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **188 evacuation centers** in **Regions XI** and **Caraga** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **79,151 families** or **303,060 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **92,392 families** or **352,083 persons** displaced in **Regions XI** and **Caraga** (see Annex F).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,252 houses** were damaged; of which, **509** are **totally damaged** and **743** are **partially damaged** in **Regions XI** and **Caraga** (see Annex G).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱130,855,854.45** worth of **food and non-food items (FNIs)** were provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Table 1).
