





DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Northeast Monsoon in Cebu

as of 15 February 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 26 January 2024 at 4:00 PM, the Northeast Monsoon affected Metro Manila, and the rest of Luzon and Visayas. On the same day, Central Visayas encountered rough to occasionally very rough sea conditions. Gale warning advisories were issued affecting the entire seaboards of Visayas due to strong to gale force winds associated with the Northeast Monsoon.

Two (2) municipalities, Madridejos and Catmon, reported adverse effects on their fisher folks caused by the persistent weather disturbance. Consequently, families, especially in coastal and island barangays, faced disruptions in their livelihoods. In response, these localities have formally requested augmentation support to assist the affected fisher folks.
