

## **DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. San Nicolas, La Paz, Iloilo City**

as of 20 February 2024, 6AM

### **I. Situation Overview**

On 18 February 2024 at around 4:15 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. San Nicolas, La Paz, Iloilo City, and was declared fire out at around 5:24 PM.

The result of the validation, indicated seven (7) damaged houses, with five (5) being completely destroyed and two (2) partially damaged. The incident has led to displacement of 157 families' equivalent to 185 individuals. Among them, 150 were identified as solo renters.

Relative to the incident, the DSWD through its Field Office in Region VI immediately coordinated with the Local Government Unit (LGU) of La Paz, Iloilo City for the provision of relief assistance to the affected families and individuals.

### **II. Status of Affected Areas and Population**

A total of **194 families** or **207 persons** are affected in **Brgy. San Nicolas, La Paz, Iloilo City** (see Annex A).

### **III. Status of Displaced Population**

#### **a. Inside Evacuation Center**

There are **six (6) families** or **six (6) persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **one (1) evacuation center** in **Brgy. San Nicolas, La Paz, Iloilo City** (see Annex B).

#### **b. Outside Evacuation Center**

There are **183 families** or **188 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### **c. Total Displaced Population**

There are **189 families** or **194 persons** displaced in **Brgy. San Nicolas, La Paz, Iloilo City** (see Annex D).

### **IV. Damaged Houses**

A total of **seven (7) houses** were damaged; of which, **five (5) are totally damaged** and **two (2) are partially damaged** in **Brgy. San Nicolas, La Paz, Iloilo City** (see Annex E).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,641,248.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex F).
