

## DSWD DROMIC Report #22 on the Effects of Trough of Low Pressure Area (LPA) as of 12 February 2024, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

On 29 January 2024, the Municipalities of Compostela, Monkayo, and New Bataan in Davao de Oro along with the Municipalities of Bunawan and Rosario in Agusan del Sur reported initial effects of the trough of a Low Pressure Area (LPA).

Subsequently, on 01 February 2024, incidents of flooding caused by sustained heavy rains from the LPA were reported in the Province of North Cotabato in Region XII (SOCCSKSARGEN) and in the Province of Maguindanao del Sur in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM).

Continuing until 02 February 2024, the LPA brought ongoing light to heavy rains, leading to additional flooding and landslides in Mindanao. By 11 AM on 03 February 2024, the LPA dissipated.

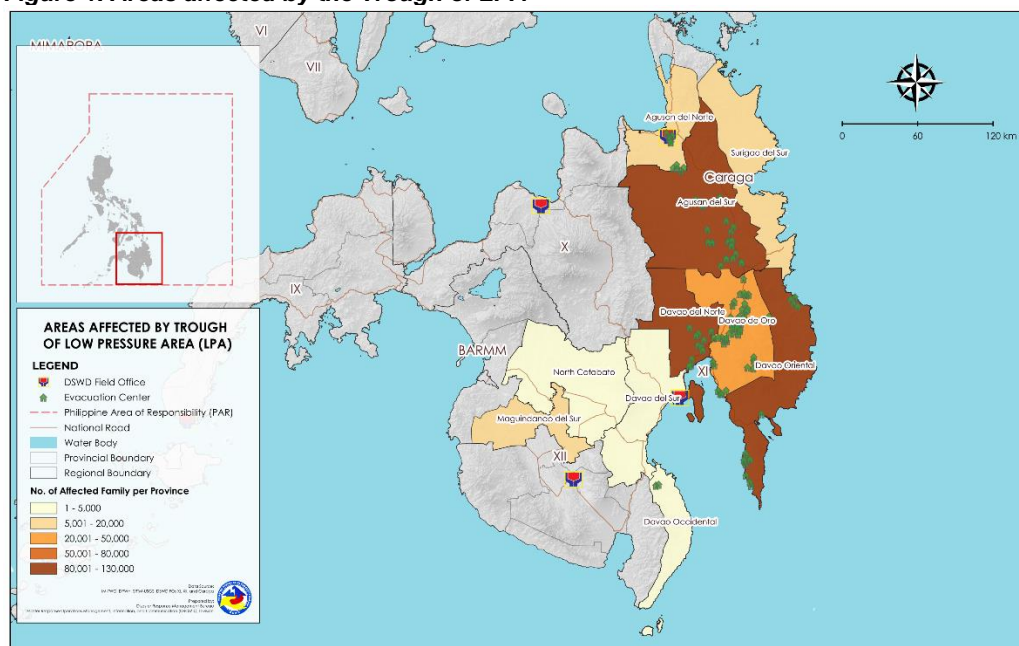
The DSWD, acting as Vice-Chair for Disaster Response, collaborates with its Field Offices in Regions XI, XII, Caraga, and BARMM, actively engaging in response operations to address displacement and protection concerns of the affected populations. Consequently, the DSWD promptly intervened by providing Relief Assistance, consisting of both Food and Non-Food Items, to meet the immediate needs of affected families and individuals.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **411,428 families** or **1,469,856 persons** are affected in **802 barangays** in **Regions XI, XII, Caraga, and BARMM** (see Annex A).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **9,611 families** or **37,953 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **150 evacuation centers** in **Regions XI** and **Caraga** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **78,961 families** or **299,764 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **88,572 families** or **337,717 persons** displaced in **Regions XI** and **Caraga** (see Annex F).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,363 houses** were damaged; of which, **558** are **totally damaged** and **805** are **partially damaged** in **Regions XI** and **Caraga** (see Annex G).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱167,048,032.75** worth of **food and non-food items (FNIs)** were provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Table 1).
