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## **DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Landslide Incidents in Maco, Davao de Oro**

as of 10 February 2024, 6AM

### **I. Situation Overview**

Issued on 06 February 2024 at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms caused by Easterlies may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Davao Region, SOCCSKSARGEN, Southern Leyte, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, and Surigao del Sur.

On the same day at approximately 7:40 PM, a landslide incident occurred in barangays Elizalde, Mainit, and Masara in Maco, Davao de Oro. The effects of Easterlies triggered the displacement of families and individuals, with three (3) buses carrying mining company employees reportedly buried. However, data pertaining to casualties is still for validation.

In response, the DSWD through its Field Office in Region XI, actively engaged in the response operation and immediately established Camp Coordination and Camp Management to address displacement and protection concerns. Likewise, administration of Family Access Card in Emergencies and Disaster (FACED) is ongoing to support the immediate needs of the affected populace caused by the incident.
