

DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the African Swine Fever in Brgy. Imelda Marcos, Hilongos, Leyte

21 March 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 27 November 2023, confirmed cases were reported on the spread of African Swine Fever (ASF) in Brgy. Imelda Marcos, Hilongos, Leyte.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, whose mortality rate can reach 100%, poses no threat to human health. However, it inflicts devastating effects on the farming economy, leading to loss of livelihood and financial difficulties for hog raisers.

In response, the DSWD, through its Region VIII Field Office, provided relief assistance to support the immediate needs of affected families and individuals. Moreover, the Municipal Agriculture Office of Hilongos, Southern Leyte, conducted disease investigation and technical assistance to the farmers.

A total of **51 families** or **205 persons** were affected in **Barangay Imelda Marcos, Hilongos, Leyte** (see Annex A).
