

## DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the Typhoid Fever Cases in Dimasalang, Masbate

23 January 2025, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

On 03 February 2024, arising cases of Typhoid fever were reported in several barangays of Dimasalang, Masbate.

Typhoid fever is an infectious disease caused by Salmonella Typhi Bacteria commonly spread through ingestion of food and water contaminated with human waste. Its common signs and symptoms include sustained high fever, headache, malaise (weakness), anorexia (loss of appetite), and diarrhea or constipation and abdominal discomfort.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **seven (7) families** or **28 persons** were affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Dimasalang, Masbate** (see Annex A).
