I. Situation Overview

On 25 March 2025 at around 4:55 PM, a fire incident occurred at 13th St., Isla Noah, Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at around 6:12 PM. *Source: DSWD Field Office (FO) NCR*

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **100 families** or **355 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

There are **100 families** or **355 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **Scalabrini Missionary Church** in **Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City** (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **25 houses** were **totally damaged** in **Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City** (see Annex C).
