



DSWD DROMIC Preparedness for Response Report #1 on the Observance of Semana Santa 2024

as of 26 March 2024, 6AM

Situation Overview

As the Asian country with the highest population of Christianity, the Philippines commemorates the yearly week-long celebration of Jesus Christ's sacrifice on the cross for the salvation of His people from sin and His gift of everlasting life. The "Semana Santa" or Holy Week starts on Palm Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday – the day where we celebrate Christ's resurrection from the dead. The whole week is observed in solemnity, with Holy Thursday and Good Friday recognized as official holidays by the state. As such, it is common that Filipinos begin to take leave from school or work as early as Holy Monday and lasting the entire week.

During this time, majority of Filipinos join the rush to go home to their respective hometowns and provinces to spend this holy festivity together with their families. Consequently, an increase in volume of people are expected in transport stations such as bus terminals, air and sea ports, which amplifies the vulnerability of these people to human-induced disasters. Naturally, we also cannot rule out the possibility of the occurrence of natural disasters during this period.

Weather Bulletin

Issued on 26 March 2024 at 4AM, the Easterlies continuously affects the eastern section of the country. Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms due to Easterlies may cause possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains over the Bicol Region, Northern Samar, Samar, Eastern Samar, and Quezon. Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to Easterlies / localized thunderstorms may cause possible flash floods or landslides or landslides during severe thunderstorms over Metro Manila and the rest of the country

Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpile and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to ₱2,409,565,560.12 with breakdown as follows (see Table 2):

a. Standby Funds

A total of **₱388,547,264.48 standby funds** in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱315,058,355.22** is the available **Quick Response Fund (QRF)** in the CO.

b. Stockpiles

A total of 1,214,479 family food packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱844,759,615.15, other food items amounting to ₱360,908,589.27, and non-food items (FNIs) amounting to ₱815,350,091.22 are available.

26 March 2024	 The Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) closely coordinates with DSWD FOs for significant disaster response updates relative to the Observance of Semana Santa 2024. DRMB closely coordinates with DOST-PAGASA for significant updates and other related information relative to the Observance of Semana Santa 2024. All DRMB Quick Response Team (QRT) members and emergency equipment are on standby and ready for deployment. NRLMB ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as need arises.

26 March 2024	 DSWD FO NCR through the Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) conducts daily monitoring through all available communication lines. DSWD FO NCR through the DRMD renders 24/7 virtual duty in the emergency operation center of the Metro Manila Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MMDRRMC). Members of the DSWD FO NCR Quick Response Teams (QRTs) and the Motorcycle Riders Group are activated and on standby to respond to any eventualities. DSWD FO NCR continuously coordinates with LGUs through their respective Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) and with the Metro Manila Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MMDRRMC) for significant disaster updates and any request of relief augmentation.

DSWD FO I staff in different Provincial Operations Offices (POOs) maintains close monitoring of their respective areas of responsibility (AORs) for any eventualities. DSWD FO I trained staff on the Incident Command System (ICS) are on standby for any possible deployment. DSWD FO I ensures the availability and readiness of resources.

26 March 2024	 DSWD FO II through its Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) continuously coordinates with the Provincial/City/Municipal Social Welfare and Development Offices (P/C/MSWDOs) and Provincial/City/Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Offices (P/C/MDRRMOs) in the provinces of Cagayan, Isabela, Quirino, Nueva Vizcaya and Batanes for significant disaster response updates. Regional Quick Response Teams (RQRTs), Social Welfare and Development Teams (SWADTs) and City/Municipal Action Teams (C/MATs) in the region are on ON-CALL/STANDBY status for any concern that needs to be addressed by the Field Office. DSWD FO X continuously monitors weather updates and closely coordinates with the Social Welfare And Development (SWAD) Team Leaders, Local Disaster Risk Reduction Management Offices (LDRRMOs) and Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) for significant updates and any request of relief augmentation. DSWD FO X ensures the availability and readiness of FNIs, vehicles, and telecommunication equipment.
25 March 2024	 DSWD FO X issued a Memorandum to the Regional, Provincial, City/Municipal Quick Response Teams (QRTs) to be on standby for possible deployment should augmentation be needed.





DSWD FO XI

26 March 2024	 DSWD FO XI Quick Response Teams (QRTs) composed of four (4) teams with nine (9) members each, are ready and available for deployment should the need arise. DSWD FO XI ensures the availability and readiness of FNIs, vehicles, and telecommunication equipment. Personnel manning the warehouse are alerted to ensure the availability of FNIs at any given time. DSWD FO XI continuously coordinates and monitors with Social Welfare and Development Offices (SWADOs), Local Disaster Risk Reduction Management Offices (LDRRMOs) and Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs), and the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) X for significant updates and any request of relief augmentation.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with concerned DSWD FOs for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.

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
