





# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Acute Viral Hepatitis A Outbreak in Brgy. Camangcamang, Isabela, Negros Occidental

as of 21 March 2024, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

In February 2024, the Municipal Health Office (MHO) of Isabela, Negros Occidental, began receiving reports of a spreading local disease that eventually developed into an outbreak diagnosed as Acute Viral Hepatitis A in an isolated area of Sitio Mantabanon, Barangay Camangcamang, Isabela, Negros Occidental.

Currently 83 families, comprising 364 individuals, were under medical observation by the Municipal Health Office (MHO) and Barangay Officials, to actively monitor the situation of the local residents while continuously advocating for proper hygiene and sanitation practices.

Relative to the incident, the DSWD through its Field Office in Region VI, promptly provided intervention to support the immediate needs of the affected families and individuals.
