

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Easterlies in San Juan, Abra

as of 29 March 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 27 March 2024, the effects of Easterlies were reported in the municipality of San Juan, Abra. The Easterlies brought a significant amount of rain which led to the displacement of families living in low-lying areas.

Local authorities and disaster management teams are actively engaged in the response operation to address the displacement concerns of the affected populations and manage the incident caused by Easterlies.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **170 families** or **608 persons** are affected in **12 barangays** in **San Juan, Abra** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Outside Evacuation Center

There are **nine (9) families** or **34 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **134 houses** were damaged; of which **seven (7)** are **totally damaged** and **127** are **partially damaged** (see Annex C).
