





DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City

as of 22 March 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On March 21, 2024, a fire broke out at Block 32 Extension, Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City, starting around 8:47 AM and was declared fire out at around 10:09 AM. The incident has led to displacement of estimated 72 families, totaling 224 individuals, with five (5) reported casualties.

The DSWD through its Field Office in the National Capital Region, actively engaged in the response operation, and continuously coordinating with the concerned LGU for significant updates and possible requests for relief augmentation and technical assistance.

A total of **72 families** or **224 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

There are 72 families or 224 persons currently taking temporary shelter in two (2) evacuation centers in Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City (see Annex B).

A total of 25 houses were totally damaged in Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City (see Annex C).
