





DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City

as of 20 March 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 19 March 2024 at around 10:34 AM, a fire incident occurred at Isla Noah, Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at around 12:30 PM.

Relative to the incident, the DSWD through its Field Office in the National Capital Region, actively engaged in the response operation, and continuously coordinating with the concerned LGU for any significant updates and possible requests for relief augmentation.

A total of 400 families or 1,600 persons are affected in Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

There are **400 families** or **1,600 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **Trinity University of Asia** in **Quezon City** (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 100 houses were totally damaged in Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City (see Annex C).
