

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz

as of 28 February 2024, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 27 February 2024 at around 2:00 PM, a fire incident occurred at Rizal Street in Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz. The fire was declared out at around 2:47 PM.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **103 families** or **366 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz** (see Annex A).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **71 families** or **268 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at **Rufina Andrada Santos Memorial School** in **Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **32 families** or **98 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **103 families** or **366 persons** displaced in **Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz** (see Annex F).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **100 houses** were damaged; of which, **98** are **totally damaged** and **two (2)** are **partially damaged** in **Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz** (see Annex G).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,401,424.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱876,424.00** from **DSWD** and **₱525,000.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex H).
