



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Armed Conflict in San Joaquin, Iloilo

as of 04 March 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 28 February 2024 at around 3AM, an armed conflict transpired between the troops of the 61st Infantry (Hunter) Battalion and Communist NPA Terrorists (CNT) of Southern Panay Front, Komiteng Rehiyon-Panay in the Municipality of San Joaquin.

Relative to the incident, the DSWD through its Field Office in Region VI, provided relief assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected families and individuals. Likewise, an additional augmentation will be provided upon request of the Local Government Unit when the affected barangays are safe to access and have secured safety clearance from the AFP.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,662 families** or **10,882 persons** were affected in **27 barangays** of **San Joaquin, Iloilo** (see Annex A).

III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,775,120.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex B).


