

## DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Lomboy, San Joaquin, Iloilo

as of 01 April 2024, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 22 March 2024 at around 12:30 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Lomboy, San Joaquin, Iloilo. The fire was declared out at around 1:20 PM.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **six (6) families** or **27 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Lomboy, San Joaquin, Iloilo** (see Annex A).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **four (4) families** or **19 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **San Joaquin, Iloilo** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

**One (1) family** or **two (2) persons** are temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **five (5) families** or **21 persons** displaced in **Brgy. Lomboy, San Joaquin, Iloilo** (see Annex E).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **seven (7) houses** were damaged; of which, **six (6) are totally damaged** and **one (1) is partially damaged** in **Brgy. Lomboy, San Joaquin, Iloilo** (see Annex F).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱41,508.00** worth of assistance was provided by the **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex G).
