

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Maritime Incident in Brgy. Baybay, San Joaquin, Iloilo

as of 04 April 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 08 March 2024 at around 9:30 AM, a motorized banca was reported missing at the water vicinities of San Joaquin, Iloilo. According to reports, the motorized banca with two (2) crew members departed from Brgy. Baybay, San Joaquin, Iloilo on 07 March 2024 to conduct fishing activities and were expected to return the next day at 6AM.

The joint forces of the San Joaquin Cost Guard Sub-station (CGSS) and Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) Team conducted immediate search and rescue (SAR) operations but were temporarily stopped due to strong winds and big waves.

According to the Local Government Unit (LGU) of San Joaquin through its Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO), the incident affected the livelihood and source of income of the families and relatives of the missing crew members.

A total of **two (2) families** or **nine (9) persons** are affected in **Brgy. Baybay, San Joaquin, Iloilo** (see Annex A).
