

# DSWD DROMIC Report #28 on the Effects of Shear Line as of 31 March 2024, 6AM

## I. Situation Overview

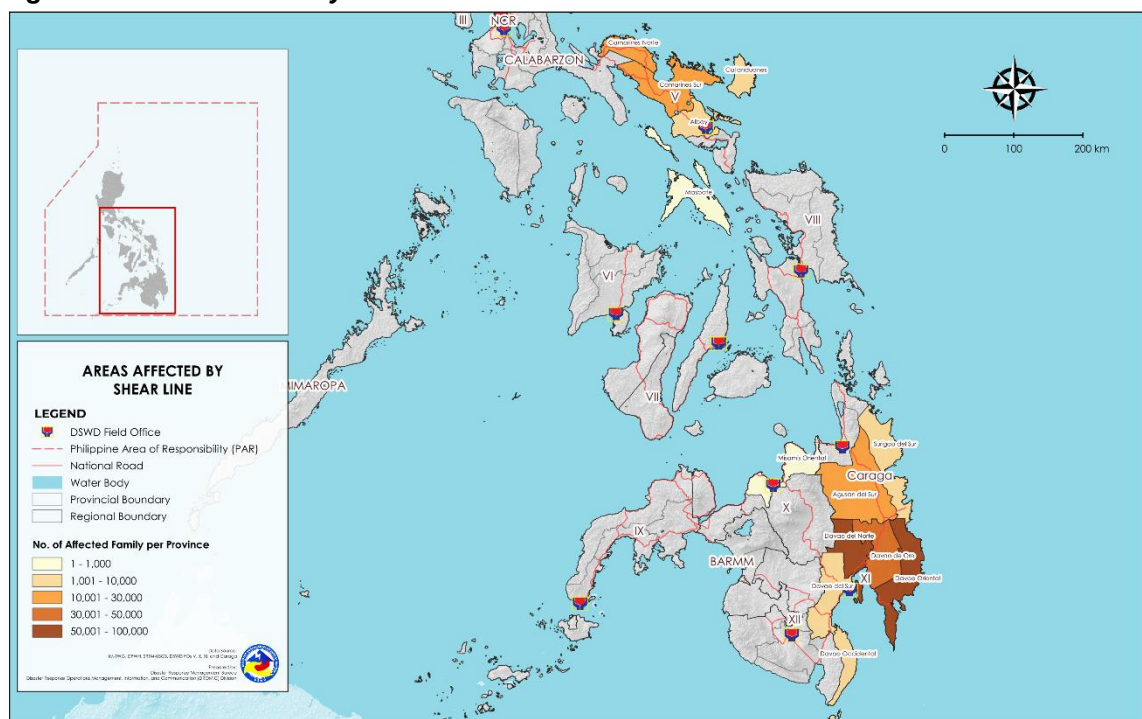
Forecasted by the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA), the Shear Line, spanning from 8 to 20 January 2024, brought adverse weather conditions across multiple regions namely: Regions V, X, XI, and Caraga. Its effects resulted to persistent heavy rains that led to flooding and landslides while, scattered thunderstorms contributed to heightened weather instability. Livelihoods of farmers were adversely affected, due to continuous heavy rains while fisher folks faced challenges as the Shear Line impacted coastal areas, disrupting fishing activities and communities faced disruptions in their daily activities.

As the Shear line gradually weakened by 20 January 2024, the situation has improved and is no longer directly affecting the country. However, the said weather disturbance has left thousands of families and individuals affected, with evacuation centers activated to cater to the needs of displaced populations and key sectors. Furthermore, several casualties were recorded yet reports are still for verification.

The DSWD as Vice-Chair for Disaster Response, together with its Field Offices in Regions V, X, XI, and Caraga, are actively engaged in the response operation to address the displacement concerns and protection issue of the affected populations. Consequently, the DSWD promptly provided intervention to support the immediate needs of the affected families and individuals by means of response and early recovery programs and services, such as Relief Assistance, Emergency Cash Transfer and Assistance for Individuals in Crisis Situations.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **271,274 families** or **1,219,636 persons** are affected in **821 barangays** in **Regions V, X, XI, and Caraga** (see Annex A).

## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **85 families** or **291 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **six (6) evacuation centers** in **Regions XI and Caraga** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **48 families** or **139 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **133 families** or **430 persons** displaced in **Regions XI and Caraga** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,555 houses** were damaged; of which, **313** are **totally damaged** and **1,242** are **partially damaged** in **Regions XI and Caraga** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱655,784,160.03** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families composed of **₱138,202,160.03 food and non-food items (FNIs)**, **₱5,389,000 financial assistance through Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS)**, and **₱512,193,000.00 financial assistance through Emergency Cash Transfer (ECT)** (see Table 1).
