



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Armed Conflict in Jovellar, Albay

as of 10 April 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 28 March 2024 at around 9:30 PM, an armed conflict transpired in barangays of San Vicente and Villa Paz in the municipality of Jovellar, Albay between thirty (30) members of the Communist National Terrorists (CNTs) and the joint forces of Albay 1st Provincial Mobile Force Company (PMFC), 505m MC, Regional Mobile Force Battalion 5 and Philippine Army.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **136 families** or **586 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Jovellar**, **Albay** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

There are **99 families** or **380 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2)** evacuation centers in Jovellar, Albay (see Annex B).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱666,025.80** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex D).

08 April 2024	 DSWD FO V maintained close coordination with the affected LGU and other concerned offices for significant updates and further relief augmentation requests. DSWD FO V through its Disaster Response Information Management Section (DRIMS) provided the MSWDO a technical assistance on DROMIC reporting.
31 March 2024	 DSWD FO V referred the wounded civilians to the Crisis Intervention Section (CIS) for the provision of medical assistance through the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS).
