





DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Easterlies in North Cotabato

as of 04 April 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 28 March 2024, the effects of Easterlies were reported in the Municipalities of Kabacan, Libungan, and Pigcawayan in North Cotabato. The Easterlies brought a significant amount of rain associated with strong winds which resulted to the displacement of families and persons.

Relative to the incident, DSWD Field Office XII actively engaged in the response operation and continuously coordinating with the affected LGUs for significant updates and possible requests for relief augmentation.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 313 families or 1,430 persons are affected in 17 barangays in North Cotabato (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Outside Evacuation Center

There are 31 families or 153 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **298 houses** were damaged; of which, **69** are **totally damaged** and **229** are **partially damaged** in **North Cotabato** (see Annex C).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P507,040.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex D).

1. Standby Funds
