





DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City

as of 26 March 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 19 March 2024 at around 10:34 AM, a fire incident occurred at Isla Noah, Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City, and was declared fire out at around 12:30 PM. The incident led to displacement of families and individuals in the community.

In response, the DSWD through its Field Office in the National Capital Region (NCR), provided relief assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected families.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **206 families** or **741 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

There are **206 families** or **741 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **Quezon City** (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **105 houses** were **totally damaged** in **Brgy. Damayang Lagi, Quezon City** (see Annex D).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱137,997.34 worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex E).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱169.44 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱4.55 million available at DSWD FO NCR.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 74,945 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 48,076 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 26,869 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 26,877 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱389.14 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.

a. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

20 March 2024	 DSWD FO NCR provided FFPs to the families and individuals affected by the fire incident.
19 March 2024	The Local Government Unit (LGU) of Quezon City provided hot meals to the affected families and individuals, and facilitated the setting up of a community kitchen.

b. Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)

19 March 2024	 The LGU of Quezon City through its Social Services and Development Department (SSDD) continuously conducts intake interviews, assessment, validation and master listing of the affected families and individuals using the Disaster Assistance Family Access Card (DAFAC).

c. Other Activities

DATE	ACTIVITIES
26 March 2024	 DSWD FO NCR continuously coordinates with the LGU of Quezon City and other concerned offices for significant updates and any relief augmentation requests. DSWD FO NCR ensured the availability of FNIs for possible augmentation support.
