

## **DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz**

as of 08 March 2024, 6PM

### **I. Situation Overview**

On 27 February 2024 at around 2:00 PM, a fire incident occurred at Rizal Street in Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz. The fire was declared out at around 2:47 PM.

In response, the DSWD through its Field Office in Region VI, together with the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Roxas City, provided relief assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected families.

### **II. Status of Affected Areas and Population**

A total of **103 families** or **391 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz** (see Annex A).

### **III. Status of Displaced Population**

#### **a. Inside Evacuation Center**

A total of **70 families** or **271 persons** sought temporary shelter at the **Rufina Andrada Santos Memorial School** in **Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz** (see Annex B).

#### **b. Outside Evacuation Center**

A total of **30 families** or **105 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### **c. Total Displaced Population**

A total of **100 families** or **376 persons** were displaced in **Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz** (see Annex D).

### **IV. Damaged Houses**

A total of **87 houses** were damaged; of which, **83** are **totally damaged** and **four (4)** are **partially damaged** in **Brgy. Poblacion VII, Roxas City, Capiz** (see Annex E).

### **V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided**

A total of **₱7,015,731.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; composed of **₱4,271,424.00** from the **DSWD**, **₱1,035,000.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)**, and **₱1,709,307.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex F).
