



# **DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the** Armed Conflict in Iloilo

14 April 2024, 6AM

#### **Situation Overview** Ι.

On 28 February 2024 at around 3:00 AM, an armed conflict transpired in San Joaquin, Iloilo between the troops of the 61<sup>st</sup> Infantry (Hunter) Battalion of the Philippine Army and members of the Communist NPA Terrorists (CNTs) of Southern Panay Front Komiteng Rehivon - Panay (SPF, KR-Panay) that resulted in the displacement of families / individuals and several reported casualties.

On March 04, 2024 at around 4:40 PM, a series of armed encounter again occurred in Brgy. Igsolique, Miagao, Iloilo and Brgy. Igcabito-on during the follow-up operations conducted by the government troops.

Relative to the incident, the DSWD through its Field Office in Region VI, provided relief assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected families and individuals.

#### **Status of Affected Areas and Population** П.

A total of 2,772 families or 11,322 persons are affected in 33 barangays in Iloilo (see Annex A).

#### Ш. **Status of Displaced Population**

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of 12 families or 44 persons sought temporary shelter in four (4) evacuation centers in Miagao, Iloilo (see Annex B).

- b. Outside Evacuation Center A total of **98 families** or **396 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).
- c. Total Displaced Population A total of 110 families or 440 persons were displaced in Iloilo (see Annex F).

#### IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱1,848,807.90 worth of assistance was provided by DSWD to the affected families (see Annex G).
