

# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict within the Boundaries of Pilar, Abra and Santa Maria, Ilocos Sur

as of 03 April 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 02 April 2024, an armed conflict transpired between the government troops of the Philippine Army and members of the Communist Party of the Philippines-New People's Army (CPP-NPA) within the boundaries of Pilar, Abra and Santa Maria, Ilocos Sur. According to the reports, the armed encounter had significant impact on the livelihood of the families and individuals in the affected areas.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **559 families** or **1,752 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Pilar, Abra** and **two (2) barangays** in **Santa Maria, Ilocos Sur** (see Annex A).

## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **127 families** or **445 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **Poblacion, Pilar Covered Court** in **Pilar, Abra** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **six (6) families** or **23 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **106 families** or **384 persons** displaced in **Pilar, Abra** (see Annex D).

## IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱ 708,115.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱ 640,555.00** from **DSWD** and **₱67,560.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex E).
