I. Situation Overview

On 10 April 2024 at around 2:30 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Arellano, Quezon, Isabela.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

One (1) family or three (3) persons are affected in Brgy. Arellano, Quezon, Isabela (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Outside Evacuation Center

One (1) family or **three (3) persons** are temporarily staying with their relatives (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

One (1) house was totally damaged in Brgy. Arellano, Quezon, Isabela (see Annex C).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱23,537.31 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱13,537.31 from DSWD and ₱10,000.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex D).
