





DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. MRR-Queen of Peace, Baguio City

as of 16 April 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 13 April 2024 at around 4:00 AM, a fire incident occurred at Purok 3, Brgy. MRR-Queen of Peace, Baguio City, and was declared fire out at around 8:00 AM. The fire incident resulted to seven (7) damaged houses and displacement of families and individuals in the community.

Relative to the incident, the DSWD through its Field Office in the Cordillera Administrative Region, together with the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Baguio City, provided relief and financial assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected families and individuals.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **70 families** or **112 persons** are affected in in **Brgy. MRR-Queen of Peace**, **Baguio City** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are seven (7) families or 11 persons currently taking temporary shelter in CDRRM Office in Brgy. MRR-Queen of Peace, Baguio City (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **63 families** or **101 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **70 families** or **112 persons** displaced in **Brgy. MRR-Queen of Peace**, **Baguio City** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of seven (7) houses were damaged; of which, six (6) are totally damaged and one (1) partially damaged in Brgy. MRR-Queen of Peace, Baguio City (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,515,592.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of ₱1,853,392.00 from the DSWD, ₱532,500.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) and ₱129,700.00 from other Partners (see Annex F).
