





DSWD DROMIC Report #15 on the Effects of El Niño

as of 04 April 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

From July 2023 to February 2024, a progression from weak to strong El Niño conditions was observed in the tropical Pacific Ocean. By March 2024, El Niño across the tropical Pacific Ocean shows signs of weakening and is expected to persist until March-April-May (MAM) 2024 season. Majority of climate models suggest a transition to ENSO-neutral conditions during the April-May-June (AMJ) 2024 season (79% chance). However, there is a likelihood for La Niña to develop (55% chance) during the June-July-August (JJA) 2024 season. With this development, the PAGASA ENSO Alert and Warning System is now raised to La Niña Watch.

The effects of El Niño were felt, with conditions leading to agricultural damage and water shortages reported in various regions as stated below:

On 18 December 2023, the provinces of Zamboanga del Norte, Zamboanga del Sur, and Zamboanga City started to experience dry condition due to the Effects of El Niño, which resulted in damages in agriculture as well as water shortage in various areas. Due to continuous Effects of El Niño, Zamboanga City declared State of Calamity (SoC) on 06 March 2024.

In Region VI, five (5) provinces – Aklan, Antique, Capiz, Iloilo and Negros Occidental due to El Niño are affected due to continues effects of El Niño which started on 23 February 2024. Prevalent dry conditions were reported, damaged crops and agricultural lands, and affected livestock due to dry conditions.

In MIMAROPA, several LGUs in the provinces of Oriental Mindoro and Occidental Mindoro declared State of Calamity (SoC) due to the effects of severe drought (the Municipality of Bulalacao on 26 February 2024; the Municipalities of Looc and Magsaysay on 06 March 2024; and, the Municipalities of Mansalay and San Jose on 07 March 2024). Several municipalities in the province of Romblon also experienced the effects of El Niño on March 2024. The absence of rainfall, leading to dwindling water sources, has posed a significant challenge to farmers in irrigating their crops such as rice, onions, and vegetables.

On February 2024, the Municipality of Capas, Tarlac reported that the livelihood of farmers, mostly from IPs (Indigenous Peoples) families, have been damaged due to the effects of the El Niño.

In BARMM, the Municipality of Hadji Muhtamad, Basilan also experienced the effects of El Niño, which resulted to water shortage and insufficient crop supply that leads to food scarcity.








II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 105,816 families or 512,630 persons are affected in 710 barangays in Regions III, MIMAROPA, VI, IX, and BARMM (see Annex A).



III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}13,802,462.00\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}8,802,462.00\$ from DSWD and \$\mathbb{P}5,000,000.00\$ from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex B).
