





DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Armed Conflict within the Boundaries of Pilar, Abra and Santa Maria, Ilocos Sur

as of 29 April 2024, 6AM

I. **Situation Overview**

On 02 April 2024, an armed conflict transpired between the government troops of the Philippine Army and members of the Communist Party of the Philippines-New People's Army (CPP-NPA) within the boundaries of Pilar, Abra and Santa Maria, Ilocos Sur. According to the reports, the armed encounter had significant impact on the livelihood of the families and individuals in the affected areas.

Relative to the incident, the DSWD through its Field Offices in Cordillera Administrative Region and Region 1, together with the Local Government Unit (LGU) and other key players in Disaster Response, actively engaged in the response operation and promptly provided relief and financial assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected families and individuals.

Status of Affected Areas and Population II.

A total of 593 families or 1,922 persons are affected in two (2) barangays in Pilar, Abra and two (2) barangays in Santa Maria, Ilocos Sur (see Annex A).

III. **Status of Displaced Population**

a. Inside Evacuation Center A total of 327 families or 1,112 persons took temporary shelter at the Poblacion Pilar Covered Court in Pilar, Abra (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

One (1) family or five (5) persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

One (1) family or five (5) persons displaced in Pilar, Abra (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}1,117,100.57\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of ₱897.673.75 from the DSWD, ₱82,560.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU), ₱94,526.82 from the Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), and **P42,340.00** from **Others** (see Annex E).
