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## DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Sambag II, Cebu City as of 28 April 2024, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 08 April 2024 at around 4:16 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Sambag II, Cebu City. The fire was declared out at around 10:16 PM.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **274 families** or **738 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Sambag II, Cebu City** (see Annex A).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **56 families** or **129 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **City Central Night High School** in **Brgy. Sambag II, Cebu City** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **218 families** or **609 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **274 families** or **738 persons** displaced in **Brgy. Sambag II, Cebu City** (see Annex D).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **91 houses** were damaged; of which, **82** are **totally damaged** and **nine (9)** are **partially damaged** in **Brgy. Sambag II, Cebu City** (see Annex E).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱10,779,970.10** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱4,542,185.10** from **DSWD** and **₱6,237,785.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex F).
