

DSWD DROMIC Report #12 on Typhoon “AGHON” as of 30 May 2024, 6AM

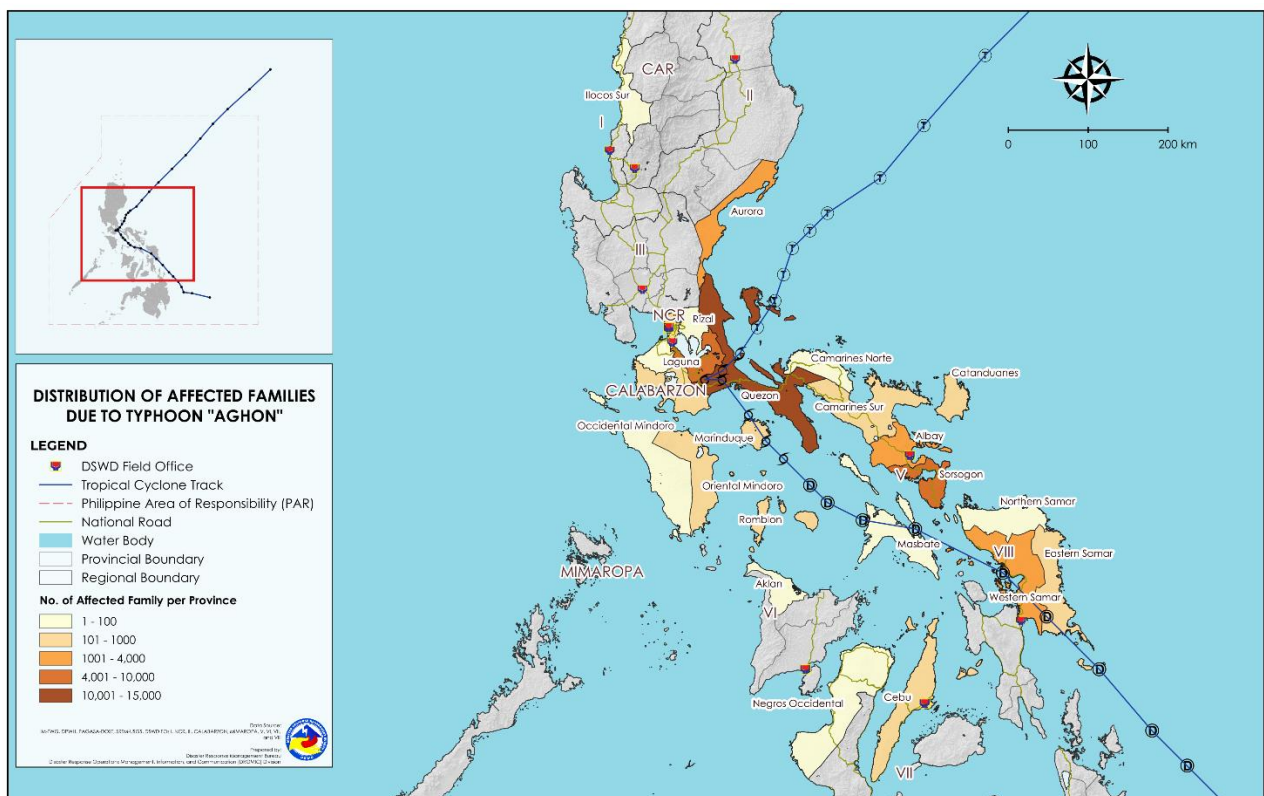
I. Situation Overview

On 29 May 2024, “AGHON” is already outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **36,549 families** or **128,511 persons** are affected in **773 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII and, VIII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **652 families** or **2,321 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **57 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR and CALABARZON** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **1,815 families** or **7,328 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **2,467 families** or **9,649 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, CALABARZON, VI, and VIII** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,421 houses** were damaged; of which, **102** are **totally damaged** and **1,319** are **partially damaged** in **Regions CALABARZON, V, VI, and VIII** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱4,913,965.60** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱3,644,880.60** from **DSWD**, **₱1,215,945.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGU)** and **₱53,140.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex G).
