

DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. Carol-an, City of Kabankalan, Negros Occidental

as of 09 June 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On May 6, 2024, at around 5:00 PM, an armed conflict occurred in Brgy. Carol-an, City of Kabankalan, Negros Occidental, between the Philippine Army's 94th Infantry Battalion (94IB) and members of the Communist Party of the Philippines-New People's Army (CPP-NPA). This conflict led to the displacement of families and individuals in the community and affected the nearby Barangay Ayungon in, Negros Oriental.

Relative to the incident, the DSWD through its Field Office in Region VI and VII, together with the concerned Local Government Units (LGUs), provided relief and financial assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected families and individuals.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **187 families** or **755 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Carol-an, City of Kabankalan, Negros Occidental** and **Brgy. Carol-an, Ayungon, Negros Oriental** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **115 families** or **466 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **Covered Court** in **Brgy. Carol-an, City of Kabankalan, Negros Occidental** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **63 families** or **249 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **115 families** or **466 persons** displaced in **Brgy. Carol-an, City of Kabankalan, Negros Occidental** (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱684,065.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱581,825.00** from **DSWD** and **₱102,240.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex C).

1. Standby Funds
