

# DSWD DROMIC Report #58 on the Effects of El Niño as of 09 May 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

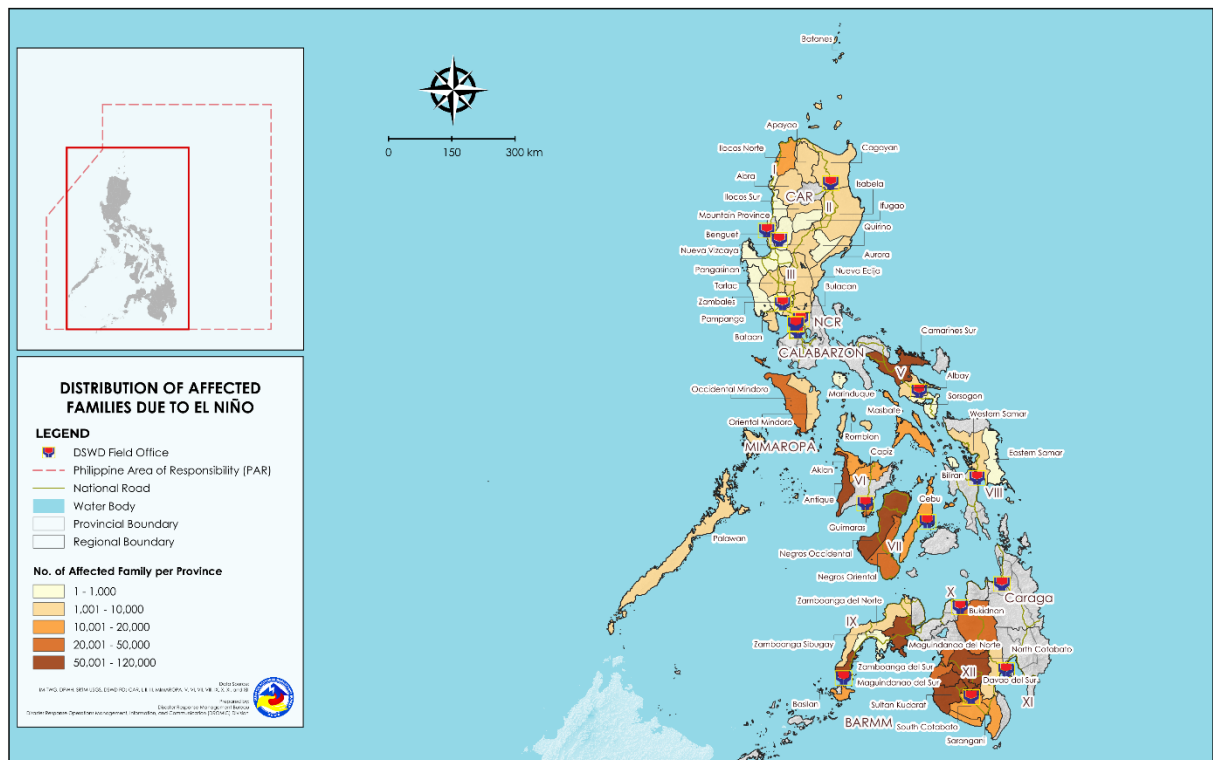
From July 2023 to March 2024, El Niño conditions were observed in the tropical Pacific Ocean. By April 2024, El Niño across the tropical Pacific Ocean continues to weaken and is expected to persist until March-April-May (MAM) 2024 season. Majority of climate models suggest a transition to ENSO-neutral conditions during the April-May-June (AMJ) 2024 season. Further, there is a likelihood for La Niña to develop (62% chance) during the June-July-August (JJA) 2024 season. As such, the PAGASA ENSO Alert and Warning System remains at El Niño Advisory / La Niña Watch.

The effects of El Niño were felt in the Philippines, with conditions leading to agricultural damage and water shortages reported in various Regions.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **915,937 families** or **3,755,318 persons** are affected in **4,879 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, CAR, and BARMM** (see Annex A).



### III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱239,968,944.47** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱221,878,644.47** from the **DSWD**, **₱9,904,300.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱1,711,000.00** from the **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱6,475,000.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex B).
