

## DSWD DROMIC Report #64 on the Effects of El Niño as of 15 May 2024, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

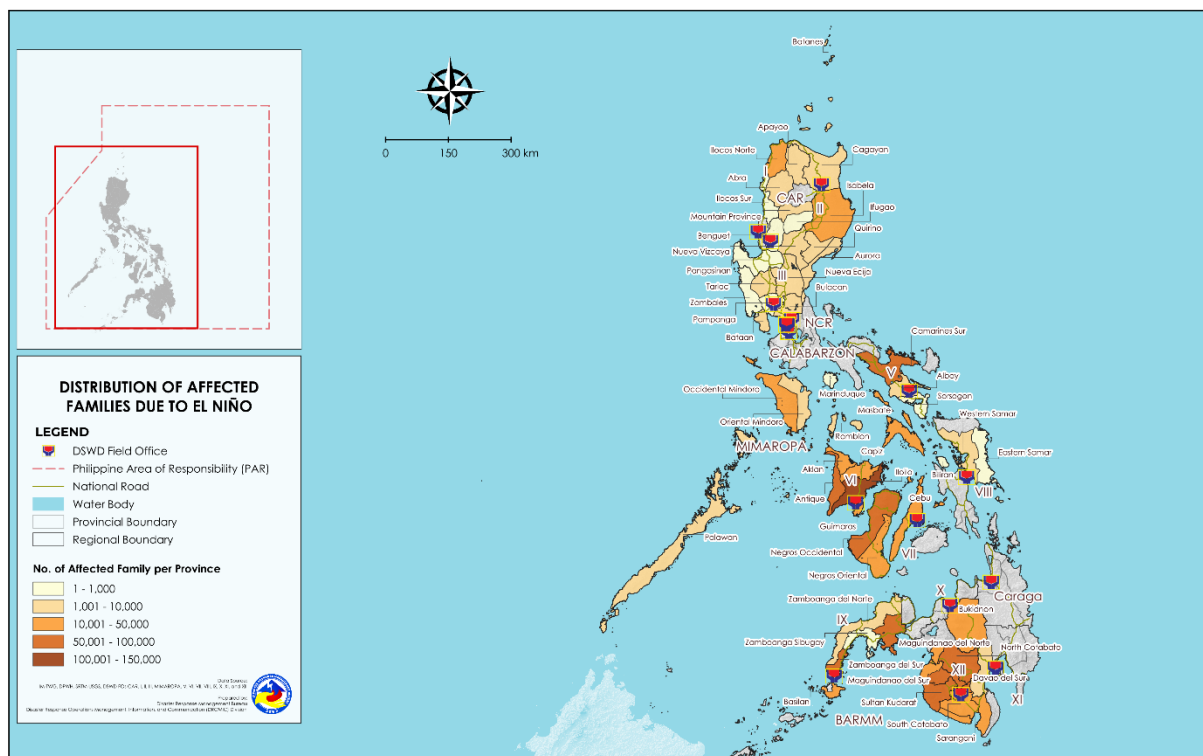
From July 2023 to April 2024, El Niño conditions were observed in the tropical Pacific Ocean. By May 2024, El Niño across the tropical Pacific Ocean continues to weaken but impacts such as hotter and drier conditions still persist. A transition to ENSO-neutral conditions is anticipated during the April-May-June (AMJ) to May-June-July (MJJ) 2024 season. However, a likelihood for La Niña to develop during the June-July-August (JJA) 2024 season has a 60% chance. With these conditions, the PAGASA ENSO Alert and Warning System still remains at El Niño Advisory / La Niña Watch.

The effects of El Niño were felt in the Philippines, with conditions leading to agricultural damage and water shortages reported in various Regions.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,072,938 families** or **4,399,550 persons** are affected in **5,326 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, CAR, and BARMM** (see Annex A).



### III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱267,705,488.92** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families: of which, **₱246,992,402.92** from the **DSWD**, **₱12,527,086.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱1,711,000.00** from the **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱6,475,000.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex B).
