

## DSWD DROMIC Report #15 on Typhoon “AGHON” as of 05 June 2024, 6AM

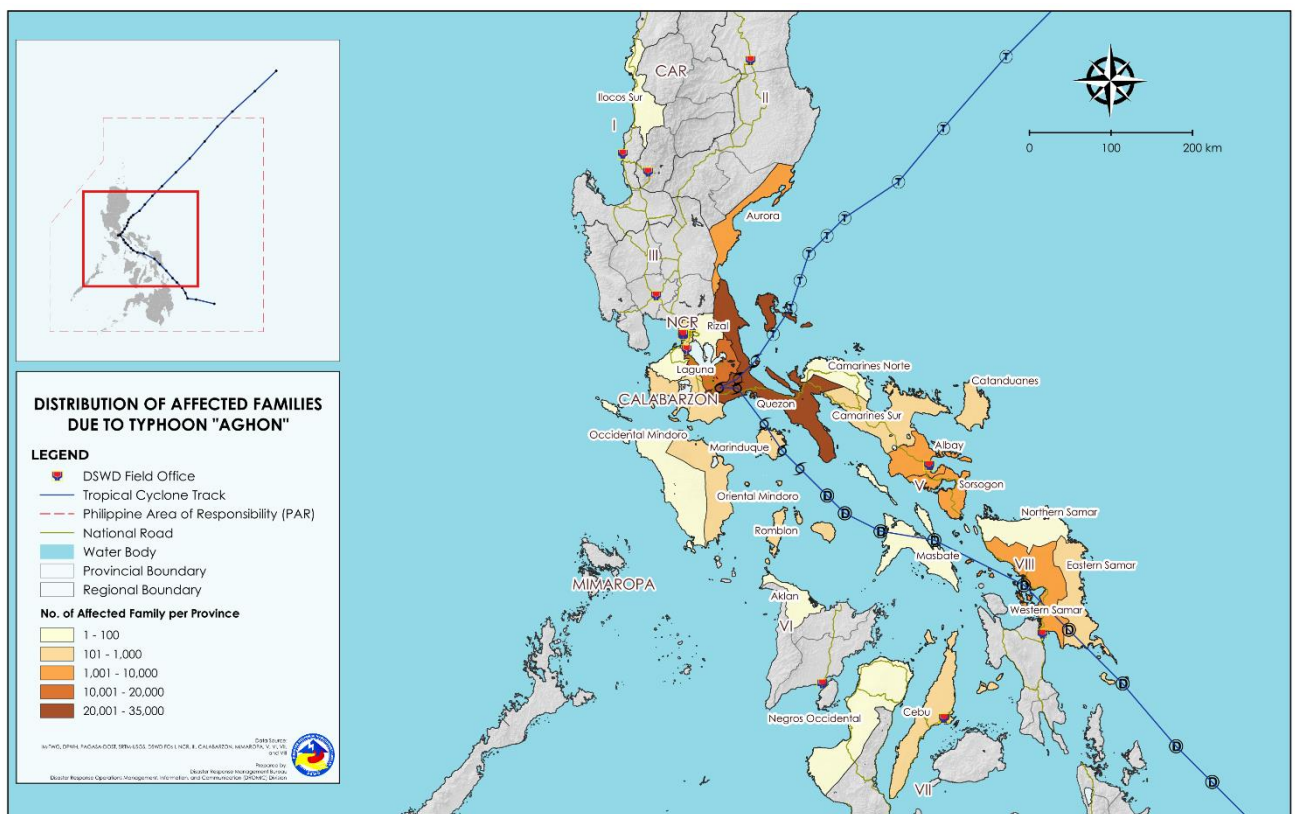
### I. Situation Overview

On 29 May 2024, “AGHON” is already outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **62,815 families** or **226,121 persons** are affected in **1,111 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII and, VIII** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **83 families** or **286 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **four (5) evacuation centers** in **Regions I, NCR, and CALABARZON** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **211 families** or **690 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **294 families** or **976 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, CALABARZON, VI, and VIII** (see Annex E).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **21,593 houses** were damaged; of which, **1,882** are **totally damaged** and **19,711** are **partially damaged** in **Regions CALABARZON, V, VI, and VIII** (see Annex F).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱19,537,473.65** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱16,996,718.15** from **DSWD**, **₱2,459,310.50** from the **Local Government Units (LGU)**, **₱6,020.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱75,425.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex G).
