

DSWD DROMIC Report #17 on Typhoon “AGHON” as of 07 June 2024, 6AM

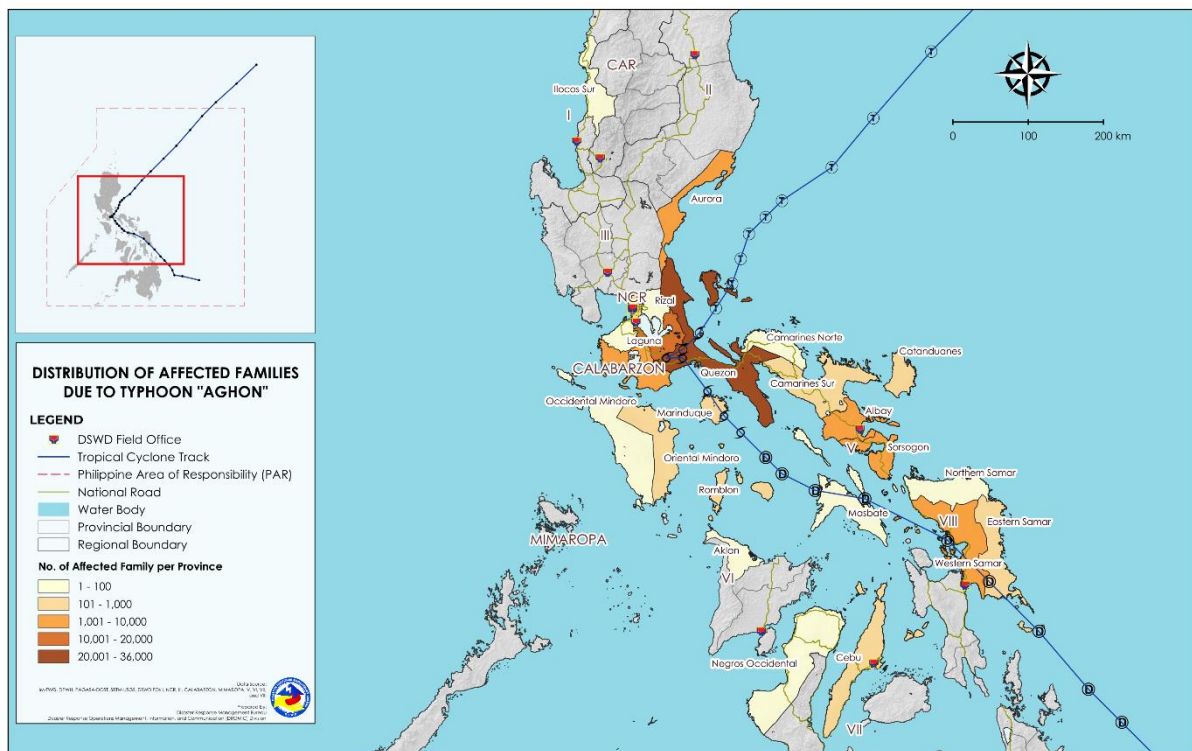
I. Situation Overview

On 29 May 2024, “AGHON” was already outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **65,568 families** or **232,203 persons** are affected in **1,119 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII and, VIII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **80 families** or **274 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **three (3) evacuation centers** in **Regions CALABARZON and NCR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **36 families** or **132 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **116 families** or **406 persons** displaced in **Regions CALABARZON, VI, VIII, and NCR** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **21,284 houses** were damaged; of which, **1,833** are **totally damaged** and **19,451** are **partially damaged** in **Regions CALABARZON, V, VI, and VIII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱29,621,490.91** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱22,759,624.41** from **DSWD**, **₱6,780,421.50** from the **Local Government Units (LGU)**, **₱6,020.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** and **₱75,425.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex F).
