
DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption as of 05 June 2024, 6AM

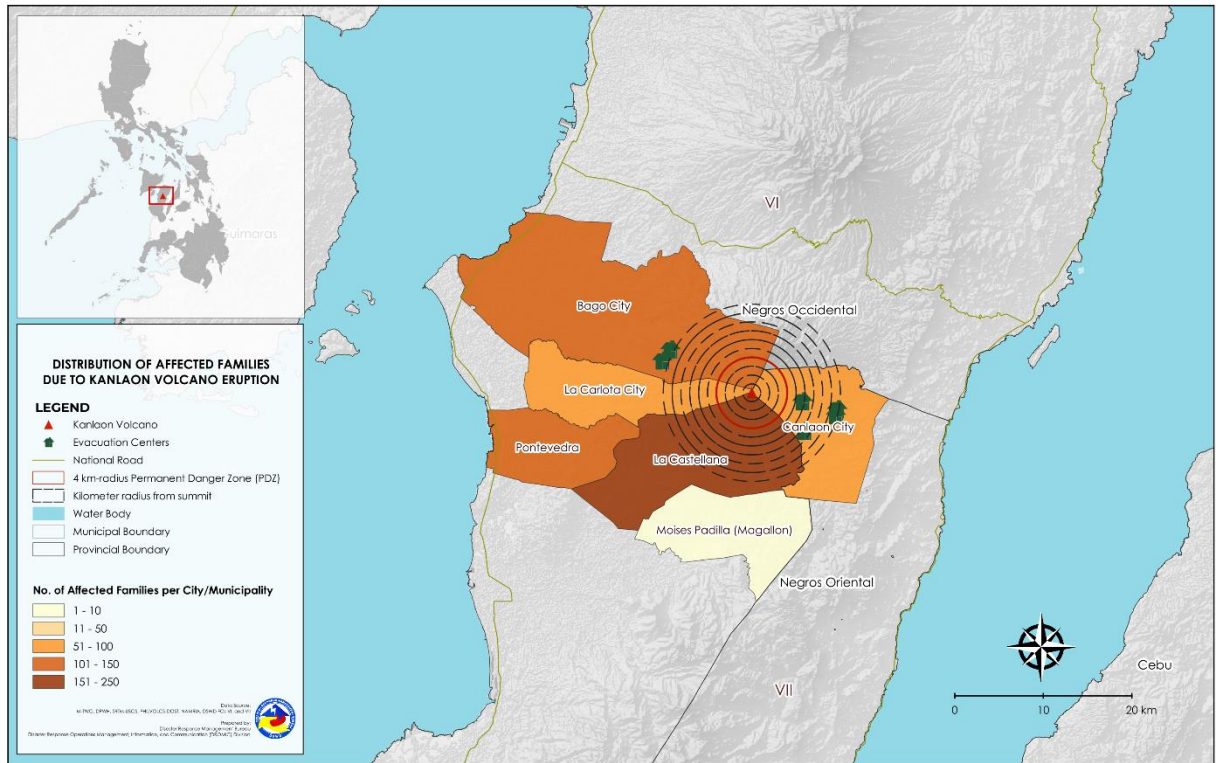
I. Situation Overview

- As of **03 June 2024 at 08:00 PM**, **Alert Level 2** was raised from Alert Level 1 over Kanlaon Volcano, which means that there is current unrest driven by shallow magmatic processes that could eventually lead to further explosive eruptions or even precede hazardous magmatic eruption.
- On 03 June 2024 at 6:51 PM, an explosive eruption occurred at the summit vent of Kanlaon Volcano. The eruption produced a voluminous and incandescent plume that rapidly rose to 5,000 meters above the vent and probable short pyroclastic density currents or PDCs approximately 2-3 kilometers down the southern and southeastern slopes based on IP and thermal camera monitors.
- The eruption lasted six (6) minutes based on the seismic record and was preceded by a relatively strong volcano-tectonic earthquake. Reports of coarse ashfall and sulfurous odors have been reported in communities on western slopes of the volcano. As of 03 June 2024, only two weak volcanic earthquakes have been recorded. Kanlaon has been exhibiting above background earthquake activity for the past month and has been degassing relatively anomalous SO₂ that has averaged approximately 1,273 tonnes/day for the year.
- The public is strongly advised to be vigilant and avoid the four (4) kilometer-radius Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ) to minimize risks from sudden explosions, rockfall and landslides. In case of ash fall events that may affect communities downwind of Kanlaon's crater, people should cover their nose and mouth with a damp, clean cloth or dust mask.
- Civil aviation authorities must also advise pilots to avoid flying close to the volcano's summit as ash from any sudden eruption can be hazardous to aircraft. DOST-PHIVOLCS maintains close monitoring of Kanlaon Volcano and any new development will be communicated to all concerned stakeholders.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **641 families** or **2,330 persons** are affected in **20 barangays** in **Regions VI and VII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **426 families** or **1,414 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **11 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI and VII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **45 families** or **177 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **471 families** or **1,591 persons** displaced in **Regions VI and VII** (see Annex F).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,444,605.85** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱758,070.00** from the **DSWD**, and **₱686,535.85** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex G).
