



# **DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption**

as of 06 June 2024, 6AM

#### Ι. Situation Overview

As of 06 June 2024, 12:00 AM, localized thunderstorms were expected to bring moderate to heavy rains over Kanlaon Volcano and Negros Island based on the Philippine Atmospheric Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) Thunderstorm Advisory #7 and #9. Thunderstorms in the early afternoon on 06 June 2024, generated volcanic sediment flows or lahars on the southern slopes that were detected by three seismic stations of the Kanlaon Volcano Network (KVN). These lahars began approximately around 1:00 PM and lasted 25 minutes based on the seismic record. A total of 23.75 mm of rain over a two-hour period was also recorded by the All-Weather Station of the Manghumay, Mailum, Bago City Observation Station (VKMH) of the KVN. Higher rainfall volumes may have likely occurred around the summit area of the volcano.

Lahars have been reported by netizens in various social media posts and verified by PHIVOLCS' Quick Response Team (QRT) on the field. Grey cohesive mud, plant debris and gravel have been deposited by lahars in at least four (4) waterways: Tamburong Creek, which courses through Biak-na-bato and Calapnagan, La Castellana; Intiguiwan River in Guinpanaan and upstream Baji-Baji Falls in Cabacungan, La Castellana; Padudusan Falls, Masulog, Canlaon City: and the Binalbagan River, which drains the southern flank of Kanlaon Volcano. The lahars were generally channel-confined, but flows along Tamburong Creek overflowed and dumped a few centimeters of deposit on a stretch of the main road in Biak-na-Bato, rendering this impassable to motorists.

PAGASA forecasts thunderstorms on 06 June 2024 that can bring heavy rains over Negros Island. These rains could generate lahars, muddy streamflows or muddy runoff in the above-mentioned and other rivers draining the southern Kanlaon edifice. Lahars can threaten communities along the middle and lower slopes with inundation, burial and wash out. PHIVOLCS thus strongly recommends increased vigilance and readiness of communities along rivers draining southern Kanlaon. These communities and local government units are advised to continually monitor weather conditions and take pre-emptive response measures for their safety from potential lahars. Alert Level 2 (Increased or Moderate Level of Volcanic Unrest) was raised for Kanlaon Volcano at 8:00 PM of 03 June 2024 after a moderately explosive eruption occurred at the summit crater at 6:51 PM earlier in the evening. The event was recorded as an E-type earthquake that lasted six (6) minutes based on seismic data and produced a five (5) kilometer-high voluminous eruption plume. All ten (10) seismic stations, three (3) infrasound stations and two (2) visual monitors of the Kanlaon Volcano Network (KVN) recorded the explosion. Thermal camera monitors showed material collapsing from the incandescent plume forming Pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) that descended the southern slopes to a distance of two (2) to three (3) kilometers. Incandescent ballistic ejecta were also observed to rain down from the eruption plume. Rumbling sounds generated by the eruption were heard in La Castellana and La





Carlota City, Negros Occidental and Canlaon City, Negros Oriental. Coarse ashfall reportedly fell upon barangays of these same areas and Bago City, Negros Occidental. Sulfurous odors were also experienced by residents in these areas as well as in Kanlaon Volcano Observatory-La Carlota City (KVO-LCC) and as far away as Murcia, Negros Occidental and Bacolod City.

The 6:51 PM explosive eruption was preceded at 6:47 PM by a ML3.5 volcano-tectonic or VT event at a depth of approximately 10 kilometers some two (2) kilometers north of the summit crater. VT earthquakes are associated with rock-fracturing that can be induced by thermal or pressure-related stresses with the volcanic edifice. Kanlaon has been exhibiting periodic swarms of VT earthquakes since Alert Level 1 was raised in March 2020. Since 2023 alone, five (5) advisories on increased seismic activity have been released, the latest of which was last 26 May 2024. In addition, volcanic SO2 gas emission has been unsteadily increasing since May 2023 and has averaged 1,273 tonnes/day this year, substantially above the background emission of <300 tonnes/day. Lastly, real-time ground deformation monitoring indicates that the Kanlaon edifice has been undergoing a long-term very slow-rate swelling or inflation since March 2022 based on GPS parameters and a short-term inflation since April to July 2023 based on electronic tilt parameters.

Explosive activity at Kanlaon on 03 June 2024 was immediately succeeded by profuse degassing from the summit crater that waned by 8:20 AM on 4 June 2024 based on camera monitors. Post-eruptive degassing likely entrained volcanic ash that fell as light ashfall on the southwest sector of the volcano as reported by a KVO-LCC survey team. As of 04 June, a total of 84 weak low-frequency volcanic earthquakes events have been recorded by the KVN, consistent with current low-level degassing from the Kanlaon crater. SO2 emission measured by campaign survey today has reached 4,113 tonnes/day, the highest flux this year and the second highest ever measured from Kanlaon.



There are **69 families** or **384 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

## c. Total Displaced Population

There are **399 families** or **1,669 persons** displaced in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex F).

# IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,513,844.85 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱1,423,269.00 from the DSWD, ₱1,040,875.85 from the Local Government Units (LGUs) and ₱49,700.00 from the Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) (see Annex G).
