





# DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Oil Spill Incident in New Washington, Aklan

as of 07 June 2024, 6AM

## I. Situation Overview

On 26 May 2024, an oil spill incident occurred along Lagatik River which extends from Brgy. Polo, Washington, Aklan to nearby barangays. According to the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO), the leaked oil came from a dismantled ship of the Metallica Shipyard and has been reached the nearby riverbanks and private-owned ponds.

On 28 May 2024, the Local Government Unit (LGU) of New Washington issued Executive Order No. 034 series of 2024 that suspends the fishing activities within the vicinity of the shipyard. The incident had significant impact in the livelihood of the families who are mostly fisherfolks and oyster-growers, residing in the affected areas.

The LGU of New Washington in coordination with the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) and Metallica Shipyard already conducted siphoning operations and initial results showed that the spilled oil was already contained.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **446 families** or **1,950 persons** are affected in **three (3) barangays** in **New Washington, Aklan** (see Annex A).

## III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P296,590.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families and individuals (see Annex B).
