





# DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the Red Tide Toxin in the Coastal Waters of Western Visayas

08 June 2024, 6PM

# I. Situation Overview

On 22 August 2023, several municipalities in the Province of Iloilo reported cases of suspected paralytic shellfish poisoning (PSP).

On 26 August 2023, the Department of Agriculture (DA) - Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) advised the public through Shellfish Bulletin No. 20 that shellfishes collected and tested from coastal waters of Dauis and Tagbilaran City in Bohol; and Dumanquillas Bay in Zamboanga del Sur remain positive for PSP or toxic red tide that is beyond the regulatory limit. Moreover, Saplan Bay (Ivisan and Sapian in Capiz; and, Brgys. Mambuquiao and Camanci, Batan in Aklan); coastal waters of Panay; President Roxas and Roxas City in Capiz; coastal waters of Gigantes Islands, Carles in Iloilo; and coastal waters of Altavas, Batan and New Washington in Batan Bay, Aklan were also positive for PSP.

On 21 December 2023, DA-BFAR through Shellfish Bulletin No. 30 advised the public that shellfishes collected and tested from the coastal waters of Pontevedra in Capiz; coastal waters of Dauis and Tagbilaran City in Bohol; Dumanquillas Bay in Zamboanga del Sur; Lianga Bay in Surigao del Sur; and the coastal waters of San Benito in Surigao del Norte are still positive for PSP or toxic red tide that is beyond the regulatory limit.

According to the Local Social Welfare and Development Offices (LSWDOs) of the affected LGUs, the effects of red tide have impacted the livelihood of the families / persons in the said areas.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **13,028 families** or **57,926 persons** were affected in **128 barangays** in **Western Visayas** (see Annex A).

#### III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P8,663,388.31** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **P8,283,513.31** from **DSWD** and **P379,875.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex B).
