





## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon "Carina"

as of 22 July 2024, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 22 July 2024 at 5:00PM, the center of Typhoon "Carina" was estimated based on all available data at 420 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.9 °N, 125.7 °E) with maximum sustained winds of 120 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 150 km/h moving North Northeastward slowly.

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon "Carina" will bring moderate to intense rainfall over various localities in the western portion of Luzon tonight through Wednesday.

In addition, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon "Carina" will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today: Zambales, Bataan, Aurora, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, and Visayas
- Tomorrow: Ilocos Region, Zambales, Bataan, Aurora, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, and Davao Region
- Wednesday: Ilocos Region, Abra, Benguet, Apayao, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Isabela, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Northern Samar, and the northern portion of Samar.

Today, in Central Luzon, the municipality of Mariveles in Bataan has reported the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon "CARINA". In the Bicol region, Locally Stranded Individuals (LSIs) have been reported at the Pasacao Port in Pasacao, Camarines Sur while a flooding incident was also experienced in Masbate City.


## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population


