
I. Situation Overview

On 20 July 2024, Tropical Depression (TD) "Butchoy" exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 30,374 families or 109,518 persons are affected in 174 barangays in Regions MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII and Caraga (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **113 families** or **576 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **Region VII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **10,866 families** or **42,275 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 113 families or 576 persons displaced in Region VII (see Annex D).







IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **99 houses** were damaged; of which, **15** are **totally damaged** and **84** are **partially damaged** in **MIMAROPA** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}6,684,038.16\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of \$\mathbb{P}3,454,390.16\$ from \$\mathbb{D}SWD\$ and \$\mathbb{P}3,229,648.00\$ from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex F).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱395.34 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII and Caraga.
- ₱9 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by Tropical Depression "Butchoy" through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 119,319 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 22,303 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 97,016 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 435,545 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII and Caraga.
- 831,168 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Tropical Depression "Butchoy" through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.27 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and all DSWD FOs warehouses.
