

# DSWD DROMIC Report #10 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Carina” as of 27 July 2024, 6AM

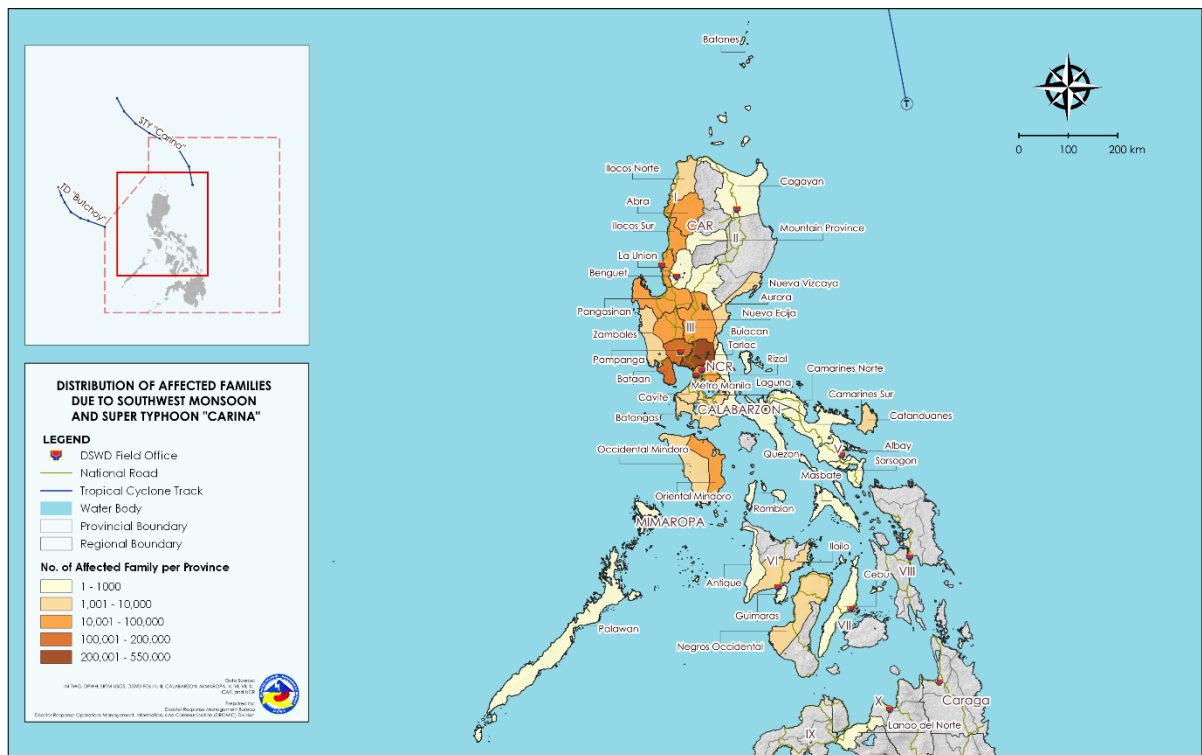
## I. Situation Overview

On 25 July 2024, Super Typhoon “Carina” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,005,434 families** or **3,277,334 persons** are affected in **3,044 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **37,690 families** or **145,753 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **906 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X and CAR** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **55,777 families** or **199,522 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **93,467 families** or **345,275 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X** and **CAR** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **630 houses** were damaged; of which, **102** are **totally damaged** and **528** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X** and **CAR** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱153,618,754.38** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱132,942,969.51** from **DSWD** and **₱20,308,868.87** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱294,600.00** from **Non-Government Organizations** and **₱72,316.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex H).
