

DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Carina” as of 27 July 2024, 6PM


I. Situation Overview

On 25 July 2024, Super Typhoon “Carina” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,020,334 families** or **3,331,627 persons** are affected in **3,116 barangays** in Regions **NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **35,135 families** or **135,477 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **897 evacuation centers** in Regions **NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **55,783 families** or **199,757 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **90,918 families** or **335,234 persons** displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X and CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **815 houses** were damaged; of which, **112** are **totally damaged** and **703** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, X and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱3,347,825,205.08** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱3,326,441,729.11** from **DSWD** and **₱20,877,359.97** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱433,800.00** from **Non-Government Organizations** and **₱72,316.00** from **Other Partners** (see Annex H).
