

# DSWD DROMIC Report #13 on Tropical Depression “Butchoy” as of 02 August 2024, 6AM

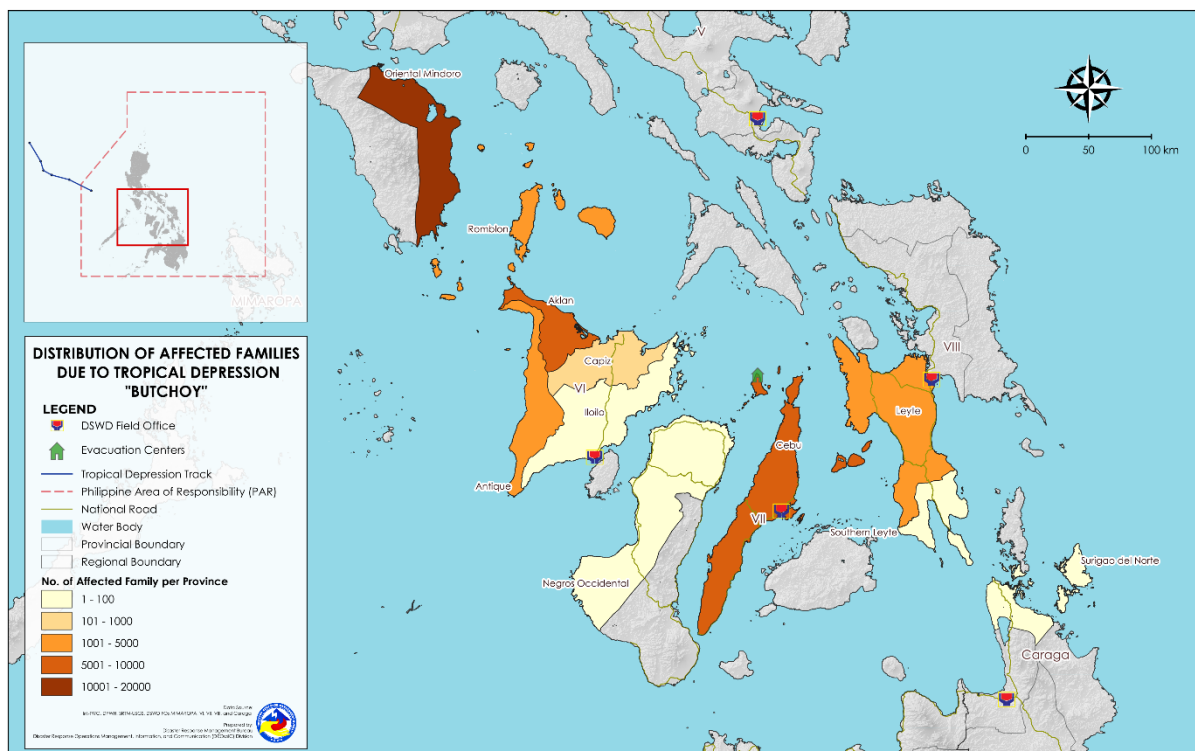
## I. Situation Overview

On 20 July 2024, Tropical Depression (TD) “Butchoy” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **36,092 families** or **129,561 persons** are affected in **186 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII and Caraga** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **113 families** or **576 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **Region VII** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **10,062 families** or **38,253 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **113 families** or **576 persons** displaced in **Region VII** (see Annex D).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **100 houses** were damaged; of which, **16** are **totally damaged** and **84** are **partially damaged** in Regions **MIMAROPA** and **VI**. (see Annex E).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱9,453,736.08** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱6,224,088.08** from **DSWD** and **₱3,229,648.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex F).

- ₱150.61 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱4 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, VII, and Caraga.
- ₱9 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by Tropical Depression “Butchoy” through inter-FO augmentation.

### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 154,159 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 51,343 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 102,816 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 388,668 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, VI, VII, VIII and Caraga.
- 630,653 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Tropical Depression “Butchoy” through inter-FO augmentation.
